Designer and urbanist with a background in architecture and social sciences. At GRCN he leads and coordinates the organisation's efforts to identify and nurture tools and processes to integrate resilience in the member cities' planning practices and accelerate the implementation of resilience projects. Braulio provides leadership and technical advice on strategic planning, engagement methods, and project preparation and development. The focus of his work is the articulation and development of complex projects such as basic services, neighbourhood upgrade, real estate development, and protective urban infrastructure.

Prior Braulio worked as urban designer and project manager at Arup. His professional experience includes coordination of complex projects for commercial clients, international organisations and NGOs. He coordinated the development of the City Resilience Framework and City Resilience Index for Rockefeller Foundation as well as teams developing complex projects such as green-blue infrastructure, mixed-use developments, railway infrastructure, aviation, social housing, and water and sanitation initiatives in post disaster context. Braulio gained technical experience in major urban projects with Arup in China, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia and the Netherlands as well as strategic advice for projects in Argentina, Chile, Brazil, Colombia, Haiti, Nicaragua, Panama, Singapore, Spain, and UK.

Braulio is also a part-time PhD researcher at University College London and a member of the Steering Committee for UNDRR's Making Cities Resilient campaign. He obtained his architecture degree at the Pontifical Catholic University of Chile and an MSc in City Design and Social Science at London School of Economics.
